



**Interfraternity Council Social Policy  
for On-Campus Mixers and Date Parties**

*Revised 9/20/12*

I. On-Campus Mixer and Date Party Regulations

Mixers and Date Parties are defined as any event that occurs on campus that includes alcohol and has restricted attendance based on organization membership or invitation by a date.

1. Properly complete the online Event Registration Form seven (7) days in advance and submit to the Office of Sorority and Fraternity Life (OSFL) for approval.
2. Chapter Presidents must check with their House Director to see if they will be present for the event. If not, they must identify the House Director on call and have the on call phone number readily available.
3. Mixers and Date Parties are not subject to walk through procedures as with invited guest list parties. Chapter leadership may request a walk through from the IFC VP of Risk Management 4 days prior to the event.
4. Chapter leaders are responsible for giving out wristbands to their own members at or above the age of 21. A designated member of the chapter executive board must pick up the wristbands from the OSFL between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. Monday through Friday or from the IFC VP of Risk Management at a time that is convenient for both parties.
5. Wristbands for Date Parties must be utilized. Chapter leadership must work with the membership to identify the age of the non-member dates prior to or at the beginning of the event.
6. Two members of the executive board of each chapter are to be substance free.
7. Non-alcoholic beverages and non-salty foods must be readily available, located at the central distribution site, and be sufficient for the amount of guests present (i.e. canned soda, water, and snacks).
8. Each guest at or above the age of 21 may bring a maximum of one six pack of canned beer.
9. Beer will be distributed by two sober members of the chapter to persons with proper wristbands.

10. Common containers (kegs, water coolers, etc.), the purchasing of alcohol with chapter funds, and illegal substances are strictly prohibited.
11. Chapter leaders are responsible for monitoring their own members. Visibly intoxicated guests should not be admitted into the event.
12. Chapter leadership has the right and obligation to remove members and non-members from an event.
13. Social functions must end by 2:00 a.m.
14. Chapter members must clean the exterior of the fraternity facility by noon the day after the event.

## II. On-Campus Mixer and Date Party Checklist

Hosting organizations must complete this checklist on their own. It is provided as a reference guide for individuals managing the event. If an IFC walk thru is requested, this is the list that will be utilized.

	Event Registration Form has been submitted to the Office of Sorority and Fraternity Life 7 days prior to the event.
	House Director is present. If not, the HD on call is _____ . The on call phone number is 404-709-0148.
	Wristbands have been distributed to attendees at or above the age of 21.
	Two members of the participating chapter's executive boards are substance free for the duration of the event.
	Non-alcoholic beverages and non-salty foods are readily available.
	Each guest is permitted to bring one 6 pack of beer and will be checked in by two sober members of the chapters participating in the event.
	Common containers (kegs, water coolers, etc.), the purchasing of alcohol with chapter funds, and illegal substances are strictly prohibited.
	Chapter leaders agree to provide a safe environment for all members and guests.
	The event will conclude by 2:00 a.m.
	Clean up of the premises will be complete by noon the following day.
